WHEREAS, Thomas A Green has served on the Washington State Emergency Management Council for over nineteen years, serving as the Chair for over seven years; and

WHEREAS, Thomas A. Green is founding co-chair of the Washington Committee on Homeland Security; and

WHEREAS, Thomas A. Green served for twenty years as a Chelan County Commissioner and was a member and chair of associated boards, including the Chelan-Douglas Board of Health, Link Transit, The Columbia River Area Agency on Aging, Regional Jail Committee, and the Chelan County Emergency Management Council; and

WHEREAS, Thomas A. Green served on the Washington State Transportation Commission, the governing body for the Washington State Department of Transportation and the Washington State Ferries, for over four years serving as Chair and Vice-Chair of the Commission during his tenure, and

WHEREAS, Thomas A. Green served twenty-nine years as a an infantry officer with the Washington Army National Guard and the U.S. Army Reserve, retiring at the rank of Colonel; and

WHEREAS, Thomas A. Green made a significant contribution to Washington State's Emergency Management and Homeland Security programs, and his expertise, judgment, and interpersonal skills have been recognized by his service on the national Standards Committee for the Emergency Management Accreditation Program;
